

We found this fun fabric, provided, at the Dallas quilt show and decided to do the blocks with browns and pinks to compliment the yummy centers. You will need a nice brown (either dark or milk chocolate) a nice pink (not too pale) and a white or cream (no prints but tone on tone is fine) for the background.

From your "chocolate "C" cut:

4 each 3 3/8" squares (cut diagonally = 8 triangles)

From your pink "A" cut:

4 each 2 1/4" squares

From your white or cream "B" cut:

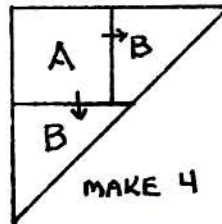
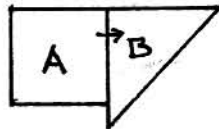
4 each 3" squares (for outside corners)

2 each 4" squares (cut diagonally, twice = 8 triangles)

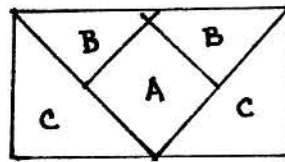
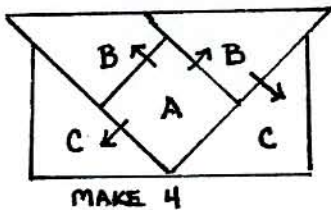
Your center "D" is furnished. Trim this to measure 5 1/2", making sure to leave equal amounts of the outside border on all sides so it will be centered.



Using scant 1/4" seams, begin by carefully adding a 4" cream "B" triangle to one side of a 2 1/4" pink square. The triangle will be a tad too large, but that's okay. Make four of these and press to cream "B". Then, add another triangle to the next side and press to cream "B".



Now, add a chocolate triangle "C" to each side and press to "C". Make four and square all units to measure 3" x 5 1/2"



SQUARE TO 3" X 5 1/2"

Assemble your block following the piecing diagram below. Arrows represent suggested pressing direction. Your completed block should measure 10 1/2" (10" finished). If you have any problems or questions, please call GLENNA (830)996-3069.
