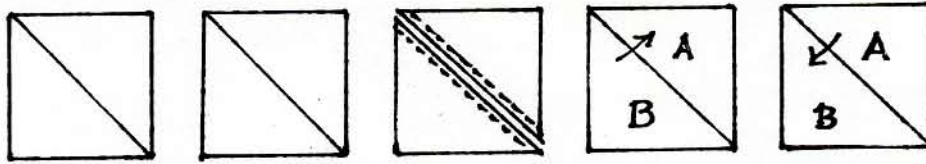


This is a really quick and simple block but should make a stunning quilt using Civil War reproduction fabrics, which we haven't done in quite a while. You will need a dark and a light. Colors aren't important as long as you have lots of contrast.

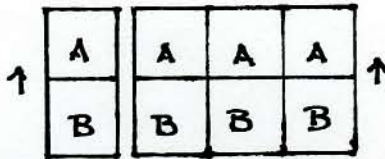
From your dark (A) cut: one 5" square and one 2 1/2" x 10 1/4" strip

From your light (B) cut: one 5" square and one 2 1/2" x 10 1/4" strip

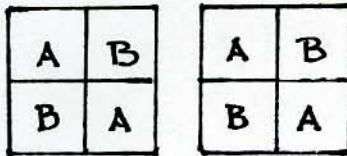
For your half square triangle units, place a 5" light (B) square face down on the 5" dark (A) square. Draw a diagonal line on back of light square. Stitch 1/4" on each side of the drawn line, cut on drawn line, open and press one to light and one to dark. Square both hst units to measure 4 1/2".



Place the 2 1/2" x 10 1/4" strips right sides facing and stitch long sides together on one side. Open and press to (A) dark. Cut strip into 4 (four) 2 1/2" x 4 1/2" segments.



From these segments, assemble two four-patch units and square both to measure 4 1/2".



Assemble your block using the piecing diagram below. Arrows represent suggested pressing direction. Completed block should measure 8 1/2" (8" finished). If you have any problems or questions, please call GLENNA (830)996-3069.
