



## VALENTINE SEE SAW

Jan 2011 due Feb meeting

This is a cool block that will make a nice quilt. We're going to use reds and/or pinks and whites or cream for Valentine's Day. You will need either two different reds or 2 different pinks or a pink and a red for (A) and ( ) pieces. You will also need a white or light cream, tone on tone (NO PRINTS)

From: A (red or pink) cut: 2 each 4" squares (goes with 4" white squares)

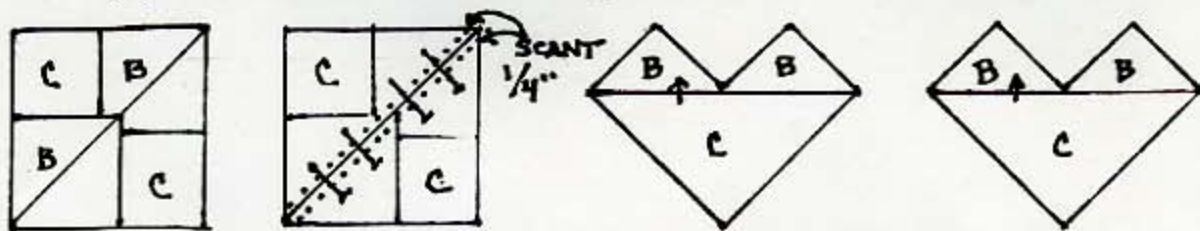
From: C (red or pink) cut: 1 each 7 1/8" square for goose units

From: B (white or light cream) cut: 2 each 4" squares (goes with 4" red or pink squares, 4 each 3 1/2" squares, 4 each 3 7/8" squares (for goose units)

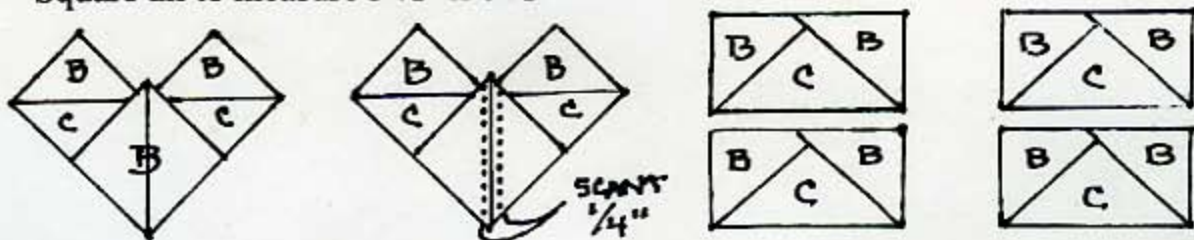
First make the half square triangle units using the 4" red or pink squares and the 4" white squares. You know the drill. Right sides together, draw a diagonal line on the backs of the white squares, stitch 1/4" on each side of the drawn lines, cut on drawn lines, open and press to A. You will have four half square triangle units. Square all to measure 3 1/2" and assemble using the diagram. This becomes your center section and should measure 6 1/2".



For goose units, place a 3 7/8" (B) square face down on two opposing corners of the 7 1/4" (A) square. One B square will overlap the other. Draw a diagonal line thru both B squares. Pin in place to keep from shifting and stitch a scant 1/4" on each side of drawn line. Cut on drawn line, open and press to (B). You'll have two "heart shaped" units.

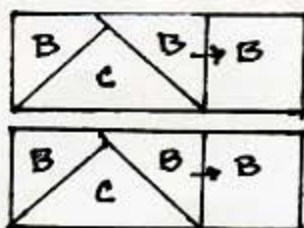
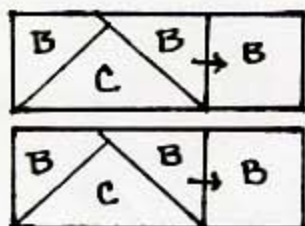


Place a 3 7/8" (B) square face down on the corners of each unit. Draw a diagonal line and stitch a scant 1/4" on each side of the drawn lines, cut on drawn lines, open and press to (B). You should have four flying geese units. Square all to measure 3 1/2" x 6 1/2".



Assemble your block using the diagram below. First, attach a 3 1/2" white (B) square to the right side of each goose unit. Total 4 units. Please note you will begin stitching at the "X" when attaching the first goose unit. Then you will attach the other goose units around the center until you end up where you began. Then, stitch you block "closed".
