

Everybody loves a blue and white quilt, at least, so I've been told. This quick block will make a really pretty quilt, I think. So, here we go. Please use blues, mediums or darks (please no turquoise or teal) and whites or creams (please no tan)(tone on tone is fine).

From your Blue (B) cut:

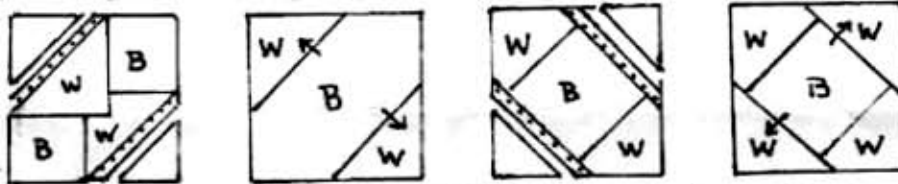
- 1 each 6 1/2" square
- 5 each 3 1/2" squares

From your White (W) cut:

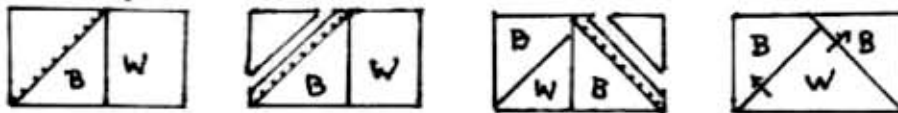
- 4 each 3 1/2" squares
- 2 each 3 1/2" x 6 1/2" rectangles

Draw a diagonal line on the backs of 4 of the 3 1/2" blue squares and the four 3 1/2" white squares. Set aside the lined blue squares and the extra blue square.

Place a white square face down on the upper left and lower right corners of the 6 1/2" blue square. Stitch just a tad to the outside of the drawn lines. Cut away corners 1/4" from seam line, open and press to white. Now, repeat the process with the remaining two lined white squares face down on the remaining corners, upper right and lower left, of your 6 1/2" blue square. See diagrams below. Completed unit should measure 6 1/2" square.



Now, make flying geese units with the 3 1/2" white rectangles and the four 3 1/2" blue squares with diagonal lines on back sides. Place a blue square face down on the upper left corner of the 3 1/2" x 6 1/2" white rectangle. Stitch just a tad to the outside of the drawn line. Cut away corners 1/4" from seam line, open and press to blue. Repeat process with a blue square face down on the right corner. See diagrams below. Make 2 goose units. Square both to measure 3 1/2" x 6 1/2".
