

Supply Sheet for Lone Star Tablerunner

Taught by Winnie Fleming

Approximate size: 14 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x 59 $\frac{1}{2}$ "

Bring the following to class:

Sewing machine
Thread to match background
Rotary cutter and mat
Long ruler with 45 degree lines
Basic sewing supplies (seam ripper, thin pins, thread clippers)
Iron *and Calculator*

FABRIC: Each block uses 5 different fabrics for the diamonds. This strip set technique will make two blocks (one and one reverse).

Fabric # 1 and # 5 will be the center and the tip of the star. All fabrics use 1/8 yard except the fabric in the # 3 position (largest band around center) which uses $\frac{1}{4}$ yard. The table runner consists of 4 blocks so choose 10 different fabrics (1/8 yard each except for two $\frac{1}{4}$ pieces) ranging from MEDIUM to DARKS with variety in print scale, texture and value. The sample used black prints with accents of Turquoise. Avoid extremely large prints with a large background area.

LIGHT (star background) - 2/3 yard

DARK (setting triangles) - 1 yard

BINDING - 3/8 yard (or 2/3 yard if added to # 3 diamond)


BACKING - 2 yards

(Come with the strips already cut for a more productive workshop.)

Fabric A - cut 1 - 1 1/4" strip

Fabric B - cut 2 - 1 1/4" strips

Fabric C - cut 3 - 1 1/4" strips

Fabric D - cut 2 - 1 1/4" strips

Fabric E - cut 1 - 1 1/4" strip

Fabric F - cut 1 - 1 1/4" strip

Fabric G - cut 2 - 1 1/4" strips

Fabric H - cut 3 - 1 1/4" strips
Binding - cut 5 - 2 1/4" strips

Fabric I - cut 2 - 1 1/4" strips

Fabric J - cut 1 - 1 1/4" strip

Fabric K - Setting Triangles - 1 yard (no pre-cutting)

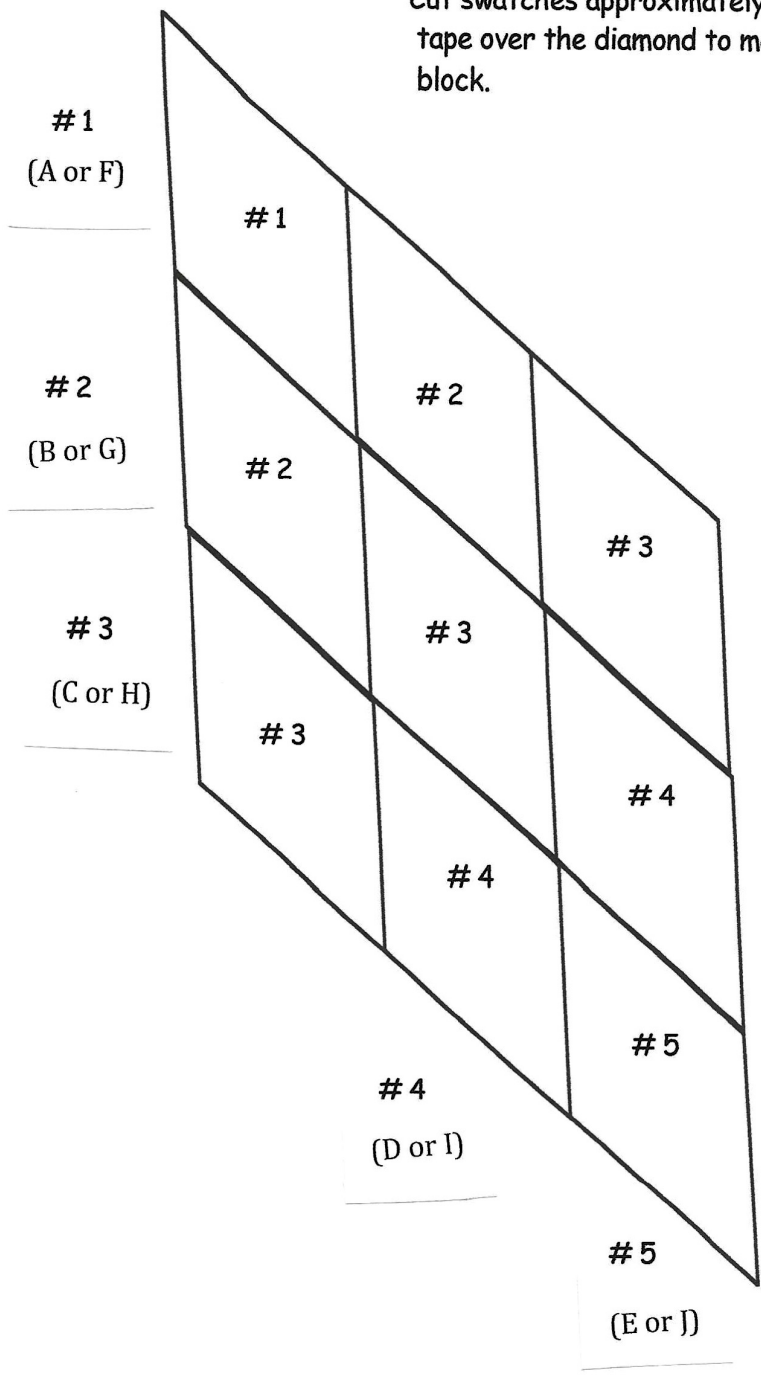
Fabric L - Star Background - 2/3 yds (no pre-cutting)

Fabric M - Backing - 2 yards

Stars # 1 and # 2:
Fabrics A, B, C, D and E

Stars # 3 and # 4:
Fabrics F, G, H, I and J

Cut swatches approximately 1" and glue or tape over the diamond to make a sample block.
